About

The Pacific Manuscripts Bureau copies archives, manuscripts, photographs and rare printed material relating to the Pacific Islands.

Formed in 1968, the Bureau is a non-profit organisation sponsored by an international consortium of libraries specialising in Pacific research. The Bureau is based in the College of Asia and the Pacific at the Australian National University and is staffed by an Executive Officer.

The Pacific Manuscripts Bureau:

- digitises archives, leaving the originals with their owners or custodians;
- provides access to copied documents to member libraries and others;
- provides national and international support to researchers with intellectual and personal endeavor relating to the Pacific Islands;
- supports archives and libraries in the Pacific Islands through advocacy, information sharing and collaborative projects that aim to build the capacity of colleagues in the Pacific Islands.

Collections

The Bureau's archive is the most extensive collection of non-Government primary documentation on the Pacific Islands. It includes over 4000 rolls of microfilm, digital copies of archives and photographs, and related published indexes.

The Bureau copies records and documents which are at risk of loss or destruction, or are difficult to access. These include archives located in Pacific Islands and archives held by individuals and organisations throughout the world, which are not accessible through libraries or archives.

The Bureau's collection includes:

- mission and church records;
- papers of non-government organisations, political parties, trade unions, environmental organisations, women's groups, youth groups and community associations;
- $\ \square$ newspapers, newsletters and other serials;
- ☐ letters, diaries, notebooks;
- genealogies and other personal or family records;
- ☐ theses from the Pacific Islands;
- unpublished novels, stories, plays, poems, songs, music and drawings;
- grammars, vocabularies and dictionaries of Pacific Island languages;
- photographs from the Pacific Islands;
- plantation, mining, trading, shipping and other business records, including cooperatives;
- papers of Pacific regional organisations;
- ☐ scientific, technical and medical papers.
