NEW CALEDONIA AS IT WAS SEVEN YEARS BEFORE ANNEXATION

A manuscript account of New Caledonia written seven years before the French took possession of that territory in 1853 was among the documents bought by the Library of the University of Hawaii at the sale in Paris in June of manuscripts and other valuable Pacific items owned by Father Patrick O'Reilly.

More than a third of the 201 items auctioned at the sale were acquired by the four member libraries of the Pacific Manuscripts Bureau. Details of the purchases of three of these libraries - the Mitchell Library, Sydney, and the National Libraries of Australia and New Zealand - were published in the last issue of Pambu.

The manuscript account of New Caledonia in 1846 was one of 12 items bought by the University of Hawaii Library. It is a document of 80 pages written by Francois Leconte, commandant of the French naval station in the Pacific and captain of the frigate Seine.

The Seine, with a crew of 200 men, was wrecked on a reef on the east coast of New Caledonia on July 3, 1846. While awaiting rescue, Leconte took the opportunity to explore the countryside and to interrogate the Marist missionaries who were his hosts. The result was a valuable account of the ceremonies, social life, wars, burials, fishing methods, pottery, etc. of New Caledonia at that time.

Although Leconte's manuscript was published in Brest in 1851 in the author's Memoires pittoresques d'un officier de marine, copies of that book are now exceedingly scarce as a large stock of them was destroyed by fire. No copies are known to exist in Australia.

The other items acquired by the University of Hawaii at the O'Reilly auction (with their sale catalogue numbers) were:

The Pacific Manuscripts Bureau was established in 1968 as part of the Research School of Pacific Studies, Australian National University, Canberra. Its purpose is to locate unpublished documents of value concerning the Pacific Islands and to obtain copies of them on microfilm for four world libraries specialising in Pacific research. The four libraries are the National Libraries of Australia and New Zealand; the Mitchell Library, Sydney; and the Library of the University of Hawaii, Honolulu.

54. A letter dated August 1, 1831 from George Platt, LMS missionary at Bora Bora, to a director of the society, in which he said that he and his fellow missionaries had the impression that the directors were neglecting them.
66. A private letter of September, 1842, from Captain Dupetit-Thouars, the French naval officer who took possession of the Marquesas Islands and who, without authorisation, subsequently established a French protectorate in Tahiti. The letter contains an explanation of his action in Tahiti.
67. Copy of a letter dated September 16, 1842, from the French residents of Tahiti to Captain Dupetit-Thouars thanking him for the "great and salutary changes" that he had brought to Tahiti, and for giving France "the most beautiful, rich and important islands in the Pacific." The letter bears the autograph of Dupetit-Thouars.
97. A 72-page account by Lieutenant Hippolyte Alix of the French corvette Artemise of voyages in the Pacific between December, 1851, and June, 1855. The Artemise called at the Marquesas, Tahiti and Honolulu.
113. A critical account by a French naval officer, Captain Gardarein-Freytet, of the administration of Gaultier de la Richerie, Governor of Tahiti and the other Etablissements francais de l'Océanie from 1858 to 1864. The document is written under the pseudonym, J-P. Chopard.
120. A letter from the Rev. Albert Pearse, a missionary of the London Missionary Society, to a friend in London describing visits to Rurutu, Rimatara and Maupiti and the progress of the Gospel there. The letter was written on Bora Bora on September 7, 1873.
126. Several printed documents and wood engravings concerning the native uprising in New Caledonia in 1878.
154. A 12-page letter dated Taiohae, February 21, 1885, from Bishop Dordillon to his friend, Commandant Henri Jouan, a former French

naval commandant in the Marquesas Islands, on affairs in the Marquesas.

177. An account by Henri Lemasson of the cyclone in the Tuamotu Archipelago in January, 1903.
181. A collection of eight Tahitian songs (with words and music) written between 1840 and 1911. One of the songs was composed by King Pomare V of Tahiti.
188. A copy of a book on Tahiti by Jean Dorsenne entitled Mauruuru Tahiti. The book was published in Paris in 1926 in an edition of 406 copies. It contains an original water colour by Octave Morillot and 20 wood engravings by Maurice L'Hoir.

SEARCHING FOR SOURCES IN HONOLULU

The executive officer of the Pacific Manuscripts Bureau, Mr Robert Langdon, left Canberra on July 23 for Salt Lake City to attend a World Conference on Records sponsored by the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

En route to the conference, he spent a week in Honolulu investigating the holdings of manuscript material on the Pacific Islands (other than Hawaii) in the libraries and archives of that city.

The following notes on holdings of the State Archives, Hawaii State Library and Hawaiian Mission Children's Society Library will, it is hoped, be agreeably surprising to Pacific scholars.

STATE ARCHIVES OF HAWAII HAS SOME UNEXPECTED ITEMS

The State Archives of Hawaii, which prides itself on the many forms of government covered by its records, has, like many such repositories, accumulated a number of documents that do not properly belong in it. Among these are manuscripts relating to the New Hebrides and Micronesia.

Two manuscripts dealing with the New Hebrides concern a recruiting voyage of the Hawaiian brig Allie Rowe (Captain George B. Holland) from May 9, 1885, to February 26, 1886. The first document is a logbook kept by J. Phillips; the other is a "record book" giving the number, name, sex, age, place of origin, period of service, date of embarkation and wages of 120-odd New Hebrideans recruited on the Allie Rowe's voyage. The latter is one of the most

informative documents about labourers recruited in the New Hebrides that has survived.

Another document of interest to New Hebrides scholars is a logbook of the Hawaiian brig Pomare (A.N. Tripp, master) for a voyage from Honolulu to Jaluit and the New Hebrides from July 1880 to February 1881. The Pomare made an extensive tour of the New Hebrides. Her log was kept by William Ramm, the chief officer.

For anyone trying to reconstruct events in the Marshall Islands of last century, a collection of papers of the Rev. Benjamin Galen Snow (d. 1880) could prove invaluable. The Snow papers consist of a diary kept at Kusaie from June to September, 1859, and letters written from Ebon and Kusaie in 1868-70.

Besides the foregoing stray items, the State Archives of Hawaii also holds at present a collection of papers belonging to the State Library of Hawaii that Pacific scholars would not expect in either repository. One collection comprises 44 letters written by Bishop Dordillon, Vicar Apostolic of the Marquesas Islands from 1855 until his death in 1888. The letters are mainly to members of the bishop's family. The earliest were written in Brest and Brazil in 1845, the year in which Dordillon first went to the Marquesas. The others bear the dates 1854, 1856, 1858, 1862, 1867(2), 1870, 1871, 1873, 1874(2), 1875, 1876, 1878(3), 1880, 1881, 1883(7), 1884(7), 1885(6) and 1886(4). With the exception of the two earliest letters, plus two from Mangareva in 1873 and 1874, and one from San Francisco in 1878, all the letters were written in the Marquesas Islands.

Another collection of papers of interest to Pacific scholars which the State Archives of Hawaii is currently holding for the State Library of Hawaii is that of Admiral Richard Thomas, flag officer commanding the British naval station in the Pacific in the early 1840's. Admiral Thomas was the man who restored independence to Hawaii after Lord George Paulet of H.M.S. Carysfort had established a British protectorate over that territory in February, 1843. Thomas also had a hand in the Anglo-French clash over Tahiti of the same period.

The State Library of Hawaii acquired the Thomas papers at the F.G. Coles sale in Melbourne in 1965. The papers contain 40 items relating to Thomas' association with Hawaii, 16 of general interest, and 19 relating to Tahiti and the Society Islands.

The Pacific Manuscripts Bureau has a detailed list of all the Thomas papers.

A GOLD MINE FOR PACIFIC SCHOLARS

The Hawaiian Mission Children's Society at 553 South King Street, Honolulu, does not, from its name, sound like the kind of place that would have much to offer a Pacific historian. To the uninitiated, the society probably seems as if it ought to have something to do with Sunday schools, whereas, in fact, it is a cultural centre (founded in 1853) with a fine collection of printed and manuscript literature on Hawaii and other Pacific Islands.

Many of the society's published treasures were collected by Governor George R. Carter, Governor of the Territory of Hawaii from 1903 to 1907. Governor Carter was inspired to begin collecting books in the Hawaiian language when he was told, during his governorship, that many of the works that the early missionaries had printed in that language had disappeared. After rescuing a number of such volumes from oblivion, Governor Carter extended his collecting to include books and other literature about the missionaries themselves; and it was later extended again to include literature on Hawaii generally.

The Society's manuscript collection includes the archives of the Hawaiian Evangelical Association (which sent Hawaiian missionaries to Micronesia and the Marquesas), as well as letters from members of the London Missionary Society in the South Pacific to missionaries in Hawaii sent out by the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions.

It was the A.B.C.F.M. which sent the first Protestant missionaries to Hawaii in 1820. The Hawaiian Evangelical Association (founded in 1853 as the Hawaiian Missionary Society) was an auxiliary of the A.B.C.F.M. Its name was changed from Hawaiian Missionary Society to Hawaiian Evangelical Association in 1863 after the A.B.C.F.M. withdrew from Hawaii, thereby recognising that Hawaii had been christianised and no longer needed a foreign mission.

The archives of the Hawaiian Evangelical Association cover the period from 1853 to 1947. They fill 16 file drawers and many feet of shelf space. A large number of records are still unsorted.

Three full file drawers plus assorted material elsewhere concern the Association's activities in islands other than Hawaii.

Drawer 8E contains 63 files relating to the Marquesas Islands. Details of these as shown on the files are given below. The letters listed from file 29 onwards are all written by Hawaiian missionaries in the Marquesas Islands. They are invariably in Hawaiian but sometimes an English translation is appended.

Drawer 11-C contains 109 files relating to the Marquesas, Micronesia, and voyages of the Morning Star. A full list of these was not made, but it was noted that they included documents connected with the attempted mission to the Marquesas in 1831-33, and correspondence of James Bicknell from the Marquesas, 1854-60.

Other items in the library of considerable interest to Pacific scholars are letters written by members of the London Missionary Society in the Society Islands and Samoa to A.B.C.F.M. missionaries in Hawaii. There is also a collection of journals of voyages of such people as C.A. Castle, J.E. Chamberlain, J.T. Gulick and R.W. Logan. The Pacific Manuscripts Bureau has a detailed list of the items mentioned in this paragraph.
